 Religion /Worldview: Christianity
 Enquiry Question: Is Christianity still a strong religion 2000 years after Jesus was on earth?
 Age: 10/11 Year Group: 6 Spring 2

 This enquiry draws on all previous learning about the concepts of Christianity that have been studied in earlier enquiries and reflects on their meaning and impact in the world today.

Christian concepts such as Lent (the 40 days leading up to Holy Week commemorating Jesus' time fasting in the desert), Shrove Tuesday (the start of Lent), Ash Wednesday (when ashes from burnt palms from the previous years' Palm Sunday are placed on believers' foreheads) are all aspect of Christian preparation for Easter. Advent is the preparation time for Christmas. Christian charities can demonstrate Jesus' teaching to love your neighbour (demonstrate Agape) There are countries where people are persecuted for being Christians and Christians have to suffer if they stand up for their beliefs.
