We will also be hosting **NSPCC Number Day** on **Friday 7**th **February**. On this day we will be joining thousands of schools and nurseries taking part in a fun-filled day of numbers. Pupil Wellbeing and Support






We are seeing an increase in attendance which is fantastic. We would love to reach our target of 97%, we can do it!

As we enter the colder months, we know that coughs and cold and other seasonal illnesses can become more common.

If a child has a very high temperature, they should stay at home and rest, however there is no need to keep them off school with a cough or common cold. To reduce the spread of germs in school, we encourage pupils to practice good hygiene habits. Please also ensure that your child comes to school with a named coat, and hat & gloves if very cold, each day.

If you have any questions or concerns regarding attendance, please contact the school office. We are here to help and support.

If your child is unable to attend school, please contact the school office via telephone **before 9am**. Please give **full details** of the reason for absence so that our admin team can code the absence appropriately . Please avoid using phrases such as **"poorly"** or **"sick"** and instead give details of symptoms.

Repeat this for **every day** of absence. If you know you may need to request leave from school for **exceptional circumstances**, such as national sports competitions or visa appointments, please complete a leave request form from the office.

EYFS ENGAGED in their new ILP 'What Happens When you Fall Asleep?' with a PJ day! The children had a great day in school wearing their pyjamas with their favourite cuddly toy. Each child practiced brushing their teeth with their own brand new toothbrush that they got to take home with them. Lots of bedtime stories were read and a hot chocolate, with a biscuit, was enjoyed to round up the fabulous day everyone had!













In Year 1, our Jigsaw Piece in PSHE this term is 'Dreams and Goals'. This week, the children discussed tackling new challenges and how this might stretch their learning. To put this to practise, the children worked hard follow the learning steps to making 'stretchy flowers'.











As part of our ENGAGE day, Year 2 have been practising their geographical skills during a walk of the local area. The children used their observation skills to spot any human or physical features within our local environment. They used the data they had collected to create tally charts and bar charts to show the most common features around our town. They then answered questions and explored ariel photographs together to develop a better understanding of the geography of our town.









Year 3 have had a great start to the term! During their first week of swimming, the children worked incredibly hard to make progress. It was brilliant to see how much they listened and enjoyed their time in the pool. To finish off our art from last term, the children painted and decorated their Greek pots. They looked at silhouette figures and added patterns to make them accurate. Their current book is, 'The Fire work Makers Daughter' and the children have been doing a lot of work around building the character. They are going to be writing their final character descriptions this week!







Year 4 have started their Burps, Bottoms and Biles topic learning all about the digestive system and their teeth. This week they have set up an investigation to answer the question, 'Which toothpaste best protects the teeth? 'They worked together to decide which variables they would keep the same, which would change and what they would measure. Thy used to eggs represent the calcium on our teeth and vinegar to represent the acid from the bacteria. They will be observing what happens daily and are intrigued about what they will discover.









Year 5 had a totally awe-inspiring visit to space to start their 'Stargazers' topic. The space dome taught us about astronauts, space shuttles, the solar system and star constellations. The children loved asking questions and their constant gasps, 'woah!' and 'look!' was testament to how much they loved it. Megan said it was 'the most fantastic thing ever!'.















Year 6 have been studying the artist Vincet van Gogh and his painting 'Starry Night'. For their independent piece they will be creating their own interpretation using the Northern Lights for inspiration. In their lesson this week, the children created a Northern Lights inspired mood board. They used a range of colours, created textures and explored how they can create perspective which will help when they create their final piece.









The children in the ARB have been settling back into their daily routines following the Christmas holidays. They have been exploring the season of winter with cold frosty days, but sadly no real snow as yet! This term the children will be focusing on opposites as part of concept learning and have started with a story called 'Bringing the rain to Kapiti Plain'. Then we will be exploring some 'Jungle fun' stories. Looking forward to lots of exciting opportunities in the coming weeks.

The total cost for the 2025-26 season will be approximately **£100**, which can be paid in instalments to make it more manageable.




COMMUNITYEVENTS
