


We would like to say a few big thank you's!

At Mount Charles School, the phrase "Every minute counts" takes on a special significance. It highlights the importance of children being present and engaged during every part of their school day. Here's why attendance is so crucial in primary school:

1. **Early Learning Foundations**: Primary school is where foundational skills like reading, writing, and basic math are established. Missing just a small part of class can make it harder for children to catch up and understand critical concepts, which could affect their progress over time.

2. **Building Good Habits**: By emphasizing that every minute counts, children learn the value of responsibility, discipline, and time management from an early age. Consistent attendance fosters a sense of routine, which helps them develop good habits that will serve them in their later academic years and life.

3. **Social Development**: Primary school isn't just about academics—it's also about socializing and learning how to work with others. Regular attendance ensures that children interact with their classmates, build friendships, and develop important social skills like communication, teamwork, and empathy.

4. **Engagement with Teachers and Activities**: Every day in primary school, children are exposed to new activities and lessons designed to engage them in different ways. When they are consistently present, they get the full benefit of these experiences, whether it's hands-on learning, group projects, or outdoor activities that promote physical development.

5. **Academic Progress**: Regular attendance ensures that children are not missing out on important lessons, assessments, or even fun, interactive learning moments. A student's academic growth is directly linked to how much time they spend learning in the classroom.

Modelling Responsibility: By showing that attendance matters, teachers and parents can model responsible behaviour for their children. It teaches them that their education is something worth showing up for, and helps instill a sense of value in their learning journey.

At Mount Charles School, every minute indeed counts because it sets the stage for the rest of a child's educational path. By emphasising the importance of showing up, we're not just teaching children the importance of attendance; we're also helping them build a strong foundation for future success.



Cross Country

We have had a very successful Cross-Country Season! The children took part in 4 qualifying races at Poltair where 11 children qualified for the Mid Cornwall Area Finals on Wednesday 19th March. From this race, the top 25 in each race made it through to the County Finals in Newquay on Tuesday 25th March. This year we had 4 Year 6 boys qualify. Riley in Year 6 won the Area final and finished 13th in the County final, which is an amazing achievement. Well done to all the children who have taken part this year.



Football

Last week a group of Year 3&4 children played a friendly match against St Mewan. The Year 3 Team all of which were playing in their first ever school match and the Year 4 B team which was made up of children who had not played much for the school before. Both teams played well, learnt lots and gained some valuable experience of playing matches. Well done to all the children who took part.



Year 3 Easter Orienteering

On Monday all of our Year 3 children took part in an Easter Orienteering event at Poltair School. The children were split into 3 groups and led by a Poltair sports leader around the course to find clues and activities. Everyone enjoyed the afternoon represented the school well.





On Thursday 8th May, we will be marking the 80th anniversary of VE day by inviting your child/ren to wear red, white and blue clothing to school for the day. Nursery have been enjoying their outdoor learning! The children have been learning about and identifying signs of spring. They have also been working collaboratively together to achieve shared goals in The Shore and Butterfly Woods.



EYFS have been exploring 'Jack and the Beanstalk' and have planted their own beanstalks! The children followed a set of instructions. First, they filled a pot with soil, then they pushed the seed down and sprayed it with water. They then placed it in the sunlight and are excited to watch it grow! The children cannot wait to see how tall their beanstalks grow!!



This week, Year 1 looked at night and day in Science and recreated how the Earth rotates using a pencil for the axis, an orange for the Earth, and a torch for the sun. The children were able to visualise how it can be night time in one country, and daytime in another. Year 1 have really enjoyed finding out about the world through lots of fun experiments this term.





As part of their topic 'Towers, Tunnels and Turrets', Year 2 visited Pendennis Castle where they took part in a 'Now and Then' workshop. They learnt all about what Pendennis Castle was used for in he past, how it's strategical position on our coastline was vital in defending our country from invasion by the enemy and about what life was like during this time. The children completed a scavenger hunt activity, searching the castle for defensive features and explored treasure chests full of artifacts from the past. They all had great fun and learnt lots of new facts!

Year 3 have had a busy few weeks! The whole class were invited to St. Austell Church where they took part in small activities, learning all about the Easter story. They tried some





washed each others hands to show respect. In school, the children have been learning about Wind and the Willows and how they can incorporate speech into a story. They then acted this out, the energy and expression used was exceptional!



In D+T, Year 4 have been investigating the design of water bottles before designing and modelling their own using Computer-Aided-Design. They thought about which shape, material and pattern would be best for a bottle to take mountain climbing and then designed their own to fit this brief. They then used 2designandmake on Purple Mash to edit points for their net and tried to replicate their design on the sides of the bottle. When they were printed, the children cut out their nets and constructed their bottles. They had to be very resilient as it was tricky but they were proud of their results.









Year 5 were given the opportunity to take part in a Stay Safe Workshop run by the Stay Safe Initiative. The first workshop was about bullying and friendships, the second workshop involved learning about online safety and digital citizenship. The children found them both very informative. This week Year 5 were invited to watch Penrice School's production of Rock of Ages which they all thoroughly enjoyed!





In geography, Year 6 have been exploring plastic pollution: conducting a survey looking at the amount of litter they found in the blue yard, the middle yard and lower yard. They analysed the results by completing maps and graphs and then created a plan as to how they can tackle plastic pollution in the playgrounds. The children enjoyed working like geographers by carrying out fieldwork and were shocked at just how many food and sweet wrappers were found in the playground!





The children in the ARB have had fun making cupcakes and decorating them. The children enjoyed weighing the ingredients and taking turns mixing the ingredients. The children have also enjoyed doing some exercise in the hall and have been learning how to following instructions. They have been learning about the story of Jack and the Beanstalk, and some of the children drew pictures to help them.
