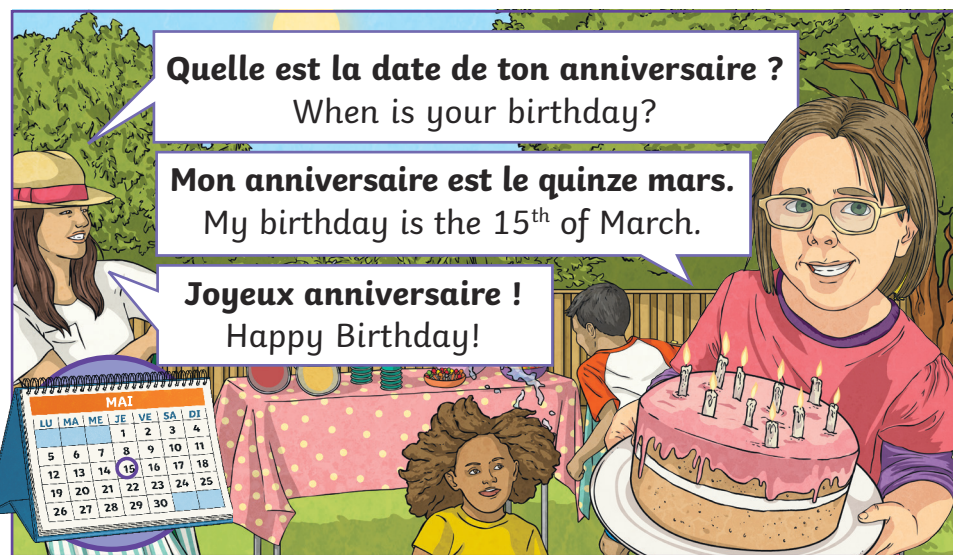

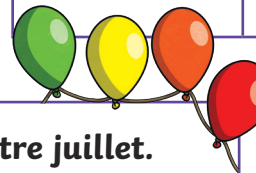
Les dates  
Dates

In French, dates are given as cardinal numbers, (1, 2, 3, etc.) instead of ordinal numbers (1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, etc.), e.g. **mon anniversaire est le vingt mai** (my birthday is the twenty of May) – except for 1<sup>st</sup> of the month which is **le premier**, e.g. **mon anniversaire est le premier juin** (my birthday is the first of June).
