## Key Knowledge

- Henry VIII was the king of England from 1509 until he died in 1547.
- Hans Holbein became the King's painter in 1532 and painted many portraits of him and other royals.
- King Henry VIII had control over the paintings painted of him and they were designed to portray wealth, power, strength and fertility.
- In 1509, King Henry VIII married Catherine of Aragon. Later in his marriage, he broke away from the Pope and the Roman Catholic Church so that his marriage could be annulled. In 1533, King Henry VIII married Anne Boleyn. In 1534, Henry became Head of the Church of England.
- After King Henry VIII died, his nine-year old son, Edward, became King for six years.
   Henry VIII's daughter, Queen Mary I, then took the throne until her death in 1558. His youngest daughter then became Queen Elizabeth I and reigned until 1603.
- Queen Elizabeth I controlled her imaged tightly towards the end of her reign.
- The Spanish Armada was defeated in 1588.
- During Queen Elizabeth I's reign, theatres were built, and music and plays were popular forms of entertainment.

Armada: a large fleet of ships. Catholic: a Christian who follows the Pope.

Protestant: a Christian who doesn't follow the Pope.

English Reformation: the breaking away of the Church of England from the authority of the Pope and the Roman Catholic Church during the 16- century.

Church of England: a protestant branch of Christianity created by Henry VIII.

Divarce: to end a marriage.

Execution: to end someone's life.

Monarch: a King or Queen of a country.


Reign: the period that a monarch rules.
