Parents Evening

We started the term with Parent's evening. Thank you to everyone who attended parent's evening – it is so important. We have also had several EYFS tours for prospective pupils for next year, where I was very proud of our Pupil Leadership Team, who spoke so eloquently to new parents about why they should send their children to this school and why the Pupil Leaders themselves enjoy being pupils at Mount Charles.

Remembrance Day

On Monday the 11th November, we commemorated Armistice Day by holding a two-minute silence at 11am. In the previous Friday's assembly, we spent time reflecting on why we have Remembrance Day and celebrated the service and bravery of our armed forces, past and present. In the weeks leading up to the 11th November, our School Councillors from Year 5 and Year 6 went to each class selling Poppy Appeal merchandise .The Royal British Legion have collected the money and we are awaiting the final total. There were a range of activities across the school. In Nursery, our pupils enjoyed art and baking activities and in Year 6, as part of their learning on 'A Child's War', they shared Poems based on Flanders Fields.

Odd Socks Day and Anti-Bullying week

On Tuesday 12th November we wore odd socks to launch National Anti-bullying week. We took this opportunity to encourage pupils to express themselves and celebrate their individuality and what makes us all unique! The odd socks represent our differences and celebrating the fact we are all different! Many children took great delight in showing mw their odd socks, which was great fun. Anti-Bullying Week is an annual event that aims to raise awareness of bullying of young people, with an emphasis on prevention and effective responses to bullying. Throughout out the week pupils discussed being kind to one another and this year's theme of 'Choose Respect', which supports the Mount Charles way of READY, RESPECT, SAFE. We also learnt the useful mnemonic 'STOP' (Several Times on Purpose) to distinguish bullying from the one-off or accidental hurting of a child.

Safeguarding

Last week was a busy week. On Monday, we started the week with an Anti-bullying Assembly. On Tuesday we wore Odd Socks to mark our uniqueness. We have talked about what bullying is and who we can talk to both in and out of school if we need help. This year the campaign was titled 'Choose Respect'.

Week 1 Attendance = 97.2%


Week 2 Attendance—95.6%

The attendance has been dropping slightly each week. We would love to see our attendance above 97% again - we did so well in the first half term.

As we enter the colder months, we know that coughs and cold and other seasonal illnesses can become more common.

If a child has a very high temperature, they should stay at home and rest, however there is no need to keep them off school with a cough or common cold. To reduce the spread of germs in school, we encourage pupils to practice good hygiene habits. Please also ensure that your child comes to school with a named coat, and hat & gloves if very cold, each day.

If you have any questions or concerns regarding attendance, please contact Mrs Nile via the school office. We are here to help and support.

If your child is unable to attend school, please contact the school office via telephone **before 9am**. Please give **full details** of the reason for absence so that our admin team can code the absence appropriately . Please avoid using phrases such as **"poorly"** or **"sick"** and instead give details of symptoms.

Repeat this for **every day** of absence. If you know you may need to request leave from school for **exceptional circumstances**, such as national sports competitions or visa appointments, please complete a leave request form from the office.

To celebrate Diwali, our Nursery children made Diva Lamps! The children all enjoyed moulding the clay using their hands and tools and loved decorating their lamp with paint, glitter and sequins. They learnt that Diwali is the Hindu Festival of light and were excited to light their lamps at home.









EYFS ENGAGED in their new ILP 'Why Do Squirrels Hide Their Nuts?' by venturing on a welly walk! On their adventure around the school, they spotted various signs of autumn such as, crunchy leaves scattered along the floor! To finish their welly walk, the children enjoyed a yummy hot chocolate with a biscuit, or 2, in Buttery Woods.









Year 1 came to school dressed as superheroes to launch their topic for Autumn Term Two. During the day, the children were set a series of challenges set to test their superhero abilities. This included designing a superhero mask, completing a very challenging assault course and creating their own Supertato based on the story. It was a great day and the children made a brilliant start to their new topic.









Year 2 had an amazing pirate day, to support their 'Land Ahoy' topic. The children experienced what pirate life was really like, trying different pirate foods, dressing like a pirate and carrying out pirate duties. They received an exciting letter from Captain Blackbeard himself asking for their help in finding his precious treasure, which had been stolen. They followed his secret treasure map and explored the school until they finally found his hidden loot. Captain Blackbeard gave the children a generous reward of golden chocolate coins for going on this dangerous quest and returning his treasure to him.









Year 3 have had a brilliant start to this half term. For their new history topic, Gods and Mortals, they watched and read the story of Theseus and the Minotaur. The children worked in groups to create freeze frames focused on specific parts of the story. In writing and reading, they have been exploring different Greek Gods and their roles within Greek mythology and daily Greek life. In Science, the children finished off our Topic all about animals and humans with an experiment. We wanted to investigate whether bigger thigh muscles meant you could jump further, then used their maths skills to measure distances of their jumps and recorded their findings in a table.



Year 4 have thoroughly enjoyed their Roman soldier experience as their Engage for 'I am Warrior'. They learnt about the similarities and differences between Roman and Celtic soldiers before designing and making their own Roman shield. The children used traditional Roman symbols such as lightening, wings and the eagle and tried to make their own handles for the back. They then practiced marching in formation using 'sin' (left) and 'dix' (right) to keep in time. They then made Roman battle formations: the testudo (turtle), the orb (circle) and the wedge (triangle).









Year 5 had a fantastic Friday designing and brewing their own imaginative potions. Some of the ingredients included hair of dog, 2 tears from unicorn taken at midnight and a scorpion claw (not attached to the body). This will not only help us with our independent writing next week when we tackle instruction writing but also when we study an extract from Macbeth 'The Song of the Three Witches'.





Year 6 dressed up as evacuees for their engage session for the topic 'A Child's War'. They walked to St Austell train station and listened to stories from evacuees who were evacuated to St Austell during World War Two. It was fascinating to discover what the children who came to Cornwall thought and they were able to empathise with how they might have felt. The experience helped immerse the children in their topic and they cannot wait to continue their learning.





The children have been very busy since our half term break learning all about different festivals and celebrations including the Hindu Festival of light - Divali.

Last week the children celebrated Children in Need by decorating a biscuit with icing spots, anti-bullying week by wearing and designing their own odd socks and on Monday we had our two minute silence for Remembrance Day. Well done everyone! Super learning.









Our Year 6 children enjoyed a residential trip to London just before October half term - our school's very first city break! With the contrast between country and city life, there were many 'Wow!' moments for our children. During their trip, the children went to Harry Potter Studios, Natural History Museum, Science Museum, Buckingham Palace, Central Gurdwara, a River Thames Cruise, and watched Matilda at the Theatre! The children stayed at a Youth Hostel and had dinner at Bella Italia and Pizza Express.
