

MOUNT CHARLES SCHOOL



We look forward to welcoming the children back to school on Monday 15th April at 8.25am. We would like to wish you all a very happy Easter.



As part of their Traditional Tales focus, EYFS have been growing magic beanstalks. The children have used rulers to measure and compare the growth of their bean. There was a lot of discussion about how we care for plants and the life cycle of flowers, fruits and vegetables. They have now been taken home to thrive in the children's care - we hope they reach the clouds soon!











In Year 1, the children were tasked to make a London bus with wheels, axles and axle holders. Thank you to all the parents who sent in boxes to help us facilitate this activity. The outcomes are excellent and the children are looking forward to taking their moving buses home!





Year 2 have been preparing for a siege, building catapults to launch projectiles over castle walls. They conducted an investigation to determine whether a catapult or a trebuchet would launch a projectile the furthest distance. The children found that a trebuchet was better because it was more springy and had a longer arm to launch the projectile further.







This week the children have made their tarts with the fruit and vegetables they selected. They learnt how to cut their fruit and vegetables and roll out pastry. They all did a fantastic job.













Year 4 have been learning about mountains and brave mountaineers! As part of design and technology, the children have been analysing different water bottles. They discussed which material and shape would be suitable for mountain climbing. Using computers, the children then began to create their designs that would suit all walkers!





Year 5 enjoyed an amazing day of languages at Penrice last week. They watched a play in French and got treated to pain au chocolate. With the help of Penrice students, they then played 'Guess Who?' in French and Spanish. They rounded off the day with a short lesson in French, Spanish and Mandarin. The






children loved learning about languages and talked with excitement about the choices they will make when they go to secondary school.

On Tuesday, a group of Year 3 and 4 footballers travelled to Biscovey School to play a friendly match. For some of these children, this was their first taste of playing a football match. They all did so well, the final score was 1-1, with our goal being scored by Olly. The team did really well and were a credit to Mount Charles.

Our fantastic 5, who had qualified for this years Cross Country County Finals, travelled to Newquay sports Centre to compete against the best runners from all over Cornwall. The weather was not great, with very heavy rain making conditions extra challenging.

Well done to all the children who took part. With almost 100 children in each race this is always one of the hardest events so well done all!





A selection of children from our choir took part in Songfest at St Petroc's Church in Bodmin. They performed 8 sea shanties alongside other schools and a live band to a church full of parents. A great musical evening was had by all!


