Choirs from seven schools within the trust - Penrice, Pondhu, Mount Charles, St Mewan, Luxulyan, Newquay Junior and Carclaze, performed in front of an audience of parents and teachers. The finale was a fantastic rendition of Fix You by Coldplay which all schools sang together. We have received brilliant feedback and hope to make it and annual event that brings together the schools in our Trust.

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To ENGAGE in their new ILP, 'Why Do Squirrels Hide Their Nuts?' EYFS went on a signs of autumn welly walk around the school and used their five senses to explore the season of autumn. To finish, the children listened to the story 'We're Going On a Bear Hunt' whilst enjoying a hot chocolate and biscuit in the forest area.



To launch the Maths App - Numbots, Year 1 came into to school dressed as anything number related. The children spent their maths lesson and part of the afternoon creating their Numbot robots and exploring the Numbot games which are designed to support and challenge the children with their mental arithmetic. There was a real buzz across the year group and we were impressed with the engagement the children showed throughout the day.



Year 2 have been exploring materials. The children have enjoyed finding out how the shapes of solid objects can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching them. They experimented with different materials, such as plastic and elastic, to see if they were able to bend, stretch, squash, snap or tear. Using a table, they marked their results and used these to explain their findings.









This week Year 3 have continued to experiment with magnets in science. They have explored which objects were magnetic and which were not. We have continued our learning about Greeks in history and have identified what they introduced to the UK culture.









Year 4 thoroughly enjoyed their visit from C4 Dance and Fitness Studios for PE this week. They learnt some excellent dance moves and practiced their new skills to a Britney Spears classic! We are very proud of how they welcomed our visitor with respect and engaged with the dancing.







Year 5's Jigsaw Piece for this half term is 'Celebrating Differences'. As part of anti-bullying week the children have been thinking about what makes people different and special and how it might make someone feel if they were bullied because of this. They also discussed what to do if they see any bullying taking place in school.





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Year 6 began their Raising Aspirations learning journey this week. Over the course of the unit, they will consider their goals for the future and what they need to do to achieve these. In the first lesson, they explored the meaning of personal qualities and identified qualities they had. The children thoroughly enjoyed making their own quality sweets!







In the ARB, the children have been exploring Diwali through dance, making paper lanterns, rangoli patterns and a clay candle holder. They have also begun exploring their new book 'Stick Man' and have made their own stick characters. In maths the children have been looking at shape, weight, length and capacity and they also have enjoyed baking bread and biscuits that they ate at snack time.







This week Mount Charles hosted Biscovey in the first home fixtures since before Covid as Penrice have kindly offered us the use of their field for our home games

Year 3 and 4 A team- won 2-0 with goals from Tommie and Ishak securing the points in the first league game.

Year 3 and 4 B team- played a friendly at the same time and won 1-0 thanks to great late goal from Harley. They were amazing and for most it was their first taste of school football!

Year 5 and 6 A team– Started the game well but the Biscovey keeper worked hard to prevent any goals leading Biscovey to take the lead with a goal. However, Mount Charles did manage to equalize just before half time with Abe scoring. After half time, we continued to score. Harrison 1, Abe 3, Leo 1 and Theo D 1, leading to a winning score of 7-1. The team played some excellent football in the second half and showed great promise for the rest of the season.

We strive for 100% attendance for all pupils. Attending school regularly is important both academically and socially. When pupils are absent from school they miss vital learning and building relationships with their friends.



How we celebrate good attendance: Each week, the class with the highest attendance is awarded the attendance trophy and an extra break time. This week's winners are 6AW with 99.3%. Well done! Our whole school attendance is 96.1%.

Lucky Draw Week: We also have a lucky draw week each half-term. In this week, any pupil who has achieved 100% for the week will receive a treat and be put into a prize draw! There will be a KS1 and a KS2 prize.

Big end of term reward: Every term we will have an attendance reward for all pupils who have achieved 96.8% or higher during that term. At the end of this autumn term, the children will be treated to a hot chocolate and Christmas film. At the start of each term (for the purpose of the reward only) we start every child's attendance at 100%. This means that every child has a chance to achieve 96.8% each term and enjoy the celebration.

Absence from school: If your child is unable to attend school, please contact the school office via telephone **before 9am**. Please give full details of the reason for absence so that our admin team can code the absence appropriately. Please avoid using phrases such as "poorly" or "sick" and instead give details of symptoms.

Repeat this for every day of absence. If you know you may need to request leave from school for **exceptional circumstances**, such as national sports competitions or visa appointments, please complete a leave request form from the office.

Yearly attendance will continue to be monitored weekly and we will send out attendance information via Class Dojo at the start of each term for any pupils with attendance below 93%. Each week, class teachers will be made aware of pupil's attendance for the year to date and may contact you to discuss your child's attendance.

Friday 15th December Last day of term. School finishes at 1:30pm. Charlies will not


be running on this day.
