The year is rounded off with units of learning based around time, shapes, symmetry and translations. We will learn about 12 and 24-hour time and calculating elapsed time. Our knowledge of quadrilaterals and triangles will develop as we learn to compare them based on their properties. We will also enjoy studying symmetry and translations too.

This half-term the topic is called 'Changing Me'. It explores how we can inherit characteristics from our parents, along with naming the necessary body parts for producing a baby. We also learn about changes and learn about strategies to help us manage and cope with a range of changes we may experience.

Holidays and Hobbies are the focus for this half-term as we begin thinking about the end of the school year.


Art

Reading

Music

English

Science

Computing

The main focus will be on the incredibly useful skill of effective searching of the internet, so that we can find what we want quickly. We will also investigate how to question the truth and reliability of information too.

Geography

It's time to enter the wonderful world of mountains. We will learn about the largest mountains across the globe and then focus our attention on the UK - where are the highest places close to home? Reading contour lines will feature too, along with learning the different ways some of the giant mountainous beasts are formed.
