MOUNT CHARLES SCHOOL



Year 4 had a fantastic time at their residential at BF Adventure Centre last week.

The children took part in a low ropes trail, a zip wire and rafted canoeing. For some of our children, this was the first time they had ever tried these activities and we were so proud of their enthusiasm and perseverance. The children stayed in cabins with bunk beds and took part in team games in the evenings and in between activities. What a way to start the summer term for Year 4!





As part of their new ILP 'Are We Nearly There Yet?', EYFS had a visit from Mr Bray and his tractor! Mr Bray showed the children the different parts of his tractor and told them what they did. He drove the tractor around the playground for the children to see the lights, hear the horn and watch the big wheels turn. The children had an amazing afternoon!





As part of their their new ILP, 'The Enchanted Woodland', the children immersed themselves into some imaginative role play. They got creative designing magic wands and they explored the school grounds collecting little bits of nature to create nature strips. The children made great links to their learning in science and noticed that lots of new flowers were beginning to blossom.














This week Year 2 have been learning about how plants grow and what plants need to help them germinate. The children have set up investigations planting seeds in different conditions so that they can observe their growth over time. They have already had some seeds begin to germinate and shoots begin to appear which has been very exciting!

In science, Year 3 are exploring the nutrients needed to help a plant grow and how this may vary from plant to plant.

The children are learning about how plants make their own food using sunlight (photosynthesis) and need extra nutrients and minerals found in fertiliser. They have set up an investigation to find out what plants need in the soil to grow well.



Year 5 had an amazing day at the Royal Cornwall Museum exploring the Egyptians as the engage activity for their new topic. They took part in a workshop about the mummification process and learnt about how the body and its organs were prepared for the afterlife - gruesome! They also handled artefacts (some of which were thousands of years old) and used them to learn about how the Egyptians lived and what they believed in. The children loved the opportunity to spend time in the museum looking at the exhibits and would like to thank the PTA who subsidised this trip and made it possible.







YEAR 6

Year 6 welcomed Mark Thomas (Deputy Lord Lieutenant of Cornwall) to talk to the children about the King, ready for them to write a biography about him. They learnt about the role the King has had as the Duke of Cornwall for most of his life and gave little insights about his passion for farming, the countryside and the environment.







In the ARB, the children have been looking forward to their class visit on Friday to Newquay Zoo: looking at maps of the zoo, creating patterns with paints of leopards and making tortoise bread. They have also been working hard on our phonics and enjoying the lovely sunshine with outdoor waterplay.





On Monday a group of Year 5 children attended a Dodgeball festival at Poltair School. The children were split into two teams, choosing boys versus girls. Both teams played some great dodgeball finishing the event playing each other with the boys team narrowly winning.







We also took a team of Year 4 children to Poltair to take part in the School Games Qualifier Dodgeball event. The children came 4th overall and did so well learning the rules and competing against other local schools. All the children seemed to enjoy the event.





Spelling Day On Friday 9th June we will be having a Spelling Day. Children will be invited to dress up as their favourite word, letter or literary technique. We will be playing spelling games, having time

on Spelling Shed and taking part in different spelling-related activities. There will also be a spelling competition across the trust where we will be competing with other schools to see if we can play the most games on Spelling Shed. The winners will receive a special prize!

There will be a treats stall selling sweets, cakes and refreshments.




