



The children studied the different stages and features of a river and then looked at these from photos and video clips of the St. Austell River. In pairs, the children then drew a detailed diagram of the river and included the stages and features you can see along the way.













This week Year 4 made butter in science and then did a taste test at the end with a cracker. They were very interested to see the stages of making butter.





Year 5 have had a very exciting start to their topic 'Allotments'. The children have set up wormeries with their own worm, which they are studying and caring for, thinking about the habitat they need to survive. They have measured the worms and will keep observations of their growth going over the next five weeks.









In geography, Year 6 have been learning about biomes. The children have explored the five main types of biome and looked at their characteristics. They drew one of the biomes in a bottle, explained this information around it and really enjoyed being able to creatively express their understanding of a biome. Linked to this, they created a biome map which identified where you find different biomes across the world.









In the ARB, the children have begun their focus on Africa with music from the Lion King, sand play and food from the oasis of the Sahara. In their tasting session of figs, olives, dates and oranges, oranges were the favourites. It was wonderful to see the children trying new tastes. In maths, they are using vocabulary of longer, taller and shorter. They are measuring objects using cubes and comparing lengths.





This week a group of Year 5 children attended a Netball Festival at Poltair School. There were 5 other schools competing in this event. Mount Charles played some great Netball. The children enjoyed the event and did gain some valuable experience.




### What to do if your child is absent:
