
This week Year 2 became chefs, taste testing various combinations of foods to create a healthy wrap. They have been learning about different food groups and which foods go well together to make a balanced diet. The children enjoyed planning their own wraps that they will be making next week.












In art, Year 3 have been studying Jackson Pollock. He is an abstract artist who uses 'Drip Painting' to create his artwork. The children experimented with paints, to create the secondary colours, to make shades, tints and to identify the contrasting colours.



In writing, Year 4 have identified the key features of a report. They have continued their work in science looking at teeth and have compared toothpaste to see which is the most effective. The children have had a lot of fun experimenting with it!







Year 5 have been using their knowledge of the Solar System to make their own using fruit. They researched the size of each planet and decided which fruit would best represent each planet. They had to decide if some of the planets were similar in size and Earth and Venus both ended up being represented by a cherry tomato with diameters of approximately 12,000km. Some groups also added an asteroid belt of crushed crackers!



The children really enjoyed their Antarctica experience this week: they huddled together in a tent; sang songs under a shelter to raise morale; experienced how cold water made their hands feel and worked together to tie knots wearing big gloves. This will help them to use empathy when writing their diary entries as Captain Scott and then as Shackleton.







The children are learning about guinea pigs: what they eat, how to stroke them and even made their own guinea pig mini houses. The children enjoyed a visit from the school guinea pigs and are becoming more confident with stroking and holding them.

What to do if your child is absent:


- Contact the school office via telephone on the first day your child's absence **before 9am**.

Repeat this for every day of absence.


