The children have discussed various road safety signs, traffic lights and built their own jigsaw road to help a family cross safely.



Year 1 have been learning about instruction writing and have developed their own instructions for making woodland crowns. children collected all the equipment they needed and followed each step in sequence. Their favourite step was gathering all the natural resources from around the school site and field!





Year 2 have been looking closely at a bean seed and what happens when it starts to germinate. The children were very excited to see the shoots appearing this week!

YEAR

Year 3 have been investigating Mount Charles's new rock garden for their topic, Tremors. The children

made observations of the rocks using technical vocabulary to make comparisons.

The children have also been making observational sketches of volcanoes from around the world. They then focused on adding watercolours, taking inspiration from the work of artist Paul Klee.









To begin studying their new topic, Burps, Bottoms and Bile, year 4 have been finding out about the human digestive system. They learnt about the six main stages of digestion and, with a combination of biscuits, bananas and other things, recreated them - it was an engaging and fun way to start their learning journey. The children have also learnt about the different types of teeth, which are a key part of the digestive process.









Year 5 'mummified' Jowan and Kara as part of their Pharaohs topic. They used

this exercise to give them inspiration for their writing - an explanation



text explaining the process. The children had to 'prepare' the bodies by washing them, covering them in

salt and spices, removing the internal organs and then decorating and wrapping the body in linen. They had a lot of fun and are now inspired to use a range of imperative verbs and adventurous vocabulary as they complete their text.





As part of their Gallery Rebels topic, year 6 have been learning about the colour wheel and investigating colours in black ink. They used chromatography to answer the question, 'What colour is black made from?'. They were surprised to see the ranges of blues and greens that separated out from two of the pens and had great discussions about why the white board pen didn't disperse at all.










