On Thursday, the children took part in the PTA sponsored Leap. The children had lots of fun leaping, jumping and skipping around the playground. So far we have raised an amazing £358.50 in sponsorship donations! Donations can be made on ParentPay until Friday 8th March.











EYFS enjoyed reading the story 'Jack and the Beanstalk' together and then followed a set of simple instructions to plant their own bean. The children placed the beans in a sunny spot in the classroom and are looking forward to watering them each day. They are very excited to watch their beanstalks grow over the coming weeks!











Year 1 launched their history topic, The Great Fire of London, by creating mixed-media artwork to represent the scene of the great fire. The children engaged very well with the launch and the outcomes were brilliant. To complement this lesson, the children learnt about the key events of the great fire and showed an excellent understanding through sequencing timelines – well done!











Year 2 have been busy exploring the strength and suitability of different materials. They looked at which materials float and sink, then used the results to decide the best material for making a boat. The children then built their own boats and gathered results about which boats held the most weight. One boat was able to hold 110 glass gems! We concluded that the best material for boat making is metal and to allow a boat to float successfully they must have tall sides.









Year 3 have been learning about where different food comes from. Using a map, the children have discussed why some fruit grows better in hotter countries. They then created fruit skewers made with strawberries, watermelon and banana. Some children even tried the plum sauce!










Year 4 have started to learn about states of matter and how these states can change when energy is added. The children had a go at making butter from cream by adding some heat energy. Their arms definitely got a workout after that much shaking! In geography, we have learnt about different features of mountains and explored how the plates collide in different ways to create different types of mountains.













In JIGSAW, Year 6 are learning how they can keep their minds and bodies healthy. This week, the children were exploring how it can be hard to make positive choices and how outside influences can affect their mental health. They looked at a story and highlighted the dangers the characters faced and the choices they could make.





This week, a group of our Year 1&2 children took part in the KS1 Cross Country event at Poltair. The children all did brilliantly and had lots of fun. Results were:

For some children it was their first ever race, so brilliant results and a huge well done!

Red Nose Day is on Friday 15th March. Our school councillors have been working hard to plan ways to raise money.





Repeat this for **every day** of absence. If you know you may need to request leave from school for **exceptional circumstances**, such as national sports competitions or visa appointments, please complete a leave request form from the office.

**Yearly attendance** will continue to be monitored weekly and we will send out attendance information via Class Dojo at the start of each term for any pupils with attendance below 93%. Each week, class teachers will be made aware of pupil's attendance for the year to date and may contact you to discuss your child's attendance.
