

MOUNT CHARLES SCHOOL



We were excited to welcome Louie Stowell, the author of the Loki series of children's books, to school on Friday 16th June. Louie told us about her life as an author and illustrator, her inspiration for her books and how school helped her to achieve her dream of becoming a children's author. We were lucky enough to see Louie completing a number of drawings using the children's ideas – these drawings then became prizes for the children who asked the most interesting questions.

Louie then spent time signing copies of her books, ensuring each child had a personalised message and illustration – it is lovely to see these books coming into school under the arms of so many of our children.





This week our choir took part in the 'Big Sing' at the Hall for Cornwall. Along with other schools from across Cornwall, they learnt and performed some upbeat songs as one big choir! Mount Charles won a gold certificate in the Cornwall Singing Schools award in recognition of the fantastic music we provide as a school. The children thoroughly enjoyed their special day.





Last week, Year 1 visited Newquay Zoo to explore all things 'Paws, Claws and Whiskers'. The children went prepared with their Zoo Bingo cards, spotting many of their favourite animals including the Squirrel Monkeys, everyones favourite, and of course the penguins! In the time, we were able to make our way around the zoo and enjoy a memorable day together.

EYFS had a fantastic trip to Porthpean beach. The children enjoyed rock pooling, paddling in the sea, playing beach games, and building sandcastles and sculptures. They found lots of different living things in the rock pool such as crabs, sea anemones, sea snails and shrimps! Thank you to all our parent helpers.









Year 2, have been exploring different moving toys, learning about how levers and linkages work. The children then attempted to make their own linkages and levers using pivot points. They will be using linkages to create their own moving minibeasts over the next few weeks.



Year 3's science unit for this term is all about light. They have looked at different types of light sources, reflectors and darkness being the absence of light. The children have also looked at the dangers of the sun. They talked about ultraviolet rays and how to protect our skin and eyes from them. We then investigated the best material for sunglasses using a light metre that measures in lux










This week Year 4 have been continuing their learning focusing on circuits and have experimented with different components to see what happens when they added more. The children noticed that when they added an extra bulb to the circuit, it was dimmer because the voltage was being split between



two. They have also continued their work on the 'great chocoplot', working in partners to act out scenes from the story. The children got in to character and showed fantastic expression!



Year 5 had an incredible day investigating their science topic at Penrice last week. They were able to use their labs and equipment and explore which materials make the best fuels for a camp fire. They used the Bunsen burners to burn a range of materials including tortilla chips, paper, pottery and cloth. The children were totally inspired scientists - here are few of their thoughts:

"I had so much fun trying new things and getting to use the Bunsen burners - I wish we could do it again. "

"My favourite lesson is science so I absolutely loved going to Penrice - it was wonderful !"







Over the last two weeks, Year 6 had the pleasure of meeting virtually with Minister Kim Moore-Cullen, a Minister of the Spiritualists' National Union. During this term the children have been reviewing the five main religions they have learnt about throughout their Primary School journey. When Kim kindly offered to speak to our pupils, it highlighted the perfect opportunity to further develop our children's understanding of the world, by asking questions about a growing religion. We are always looking for ways to nurture our pupil's spiritual

development so we are extremely grateful to Kim, and the SNU, for supporting our school. We hope we can make more links like this in the future.





The children in the ARB have been busy exploring water with their friends, sharing resources and practicing our fine motor skills to catch fish and ducks.









This week a group of Year 6 children took part in a Handball Festival, against other local schools, at Poltair School. The children enjoyed trying a new sport and competed well, winning the majority of the games. Well done all!

School Hours Update


All schools have been asked by the Government to deliver 32.5 hours across each week by September 2023; like many schools, we have made some slight changes to the timings of the school day to accommodate this.
