



PE and School Sport Action Plan

Mount Charles School 2023–2024

Background - The primary school sport premium investment goes direct to primary school and is designed to support improvements in the quality and depth of PE and school sport.

Key Indicators - The Department for Education vision is that all pupils leaving primary school are physically literate and have the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport. The objective is to achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport that delivers high quality provision of a balanced and holistic PE and school sport offer. There are 5 key indicators that schools should expect to see improvement across:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity - the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school
2. The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. Increased participation in competitive sport

Funding - Individual schools will receive funding which they can use to support the above outcomes through various options including; release of staff for CPD, employing specialists to work alongside teachers, cluster work with other schools and partnerships, transport, equipment, hall and pool hire etc. for additional sport sessions.

<p><i>MCS has two allocated PE slots each week for all infants and juniors as recommended by the Sport Premium guidance. One of these slots is taught by a PE specialist. In KS2, swimming is taught as one of these slots when possible.</i></p>	<p><i>We use a high-quality PE resource published by Val Sabin to support planning and delivery of PE at MCS. We cover all the objectives outlined in the National Curriculum</i></p> <p><i>Swimming is taught in weekly blocks. Our local pool provides swim coaches assisted by our staff. At MCS we have committed to two weekly blocks.</i></p> <p><i>Post lockdown in 2021 we introduced a ‘recovery’ unit to each year group. This was based around improving stamina and recovering some of the ABC skills (agility, balance and co-ordination) lost during lockdown. We will again teach this unit as it replaces a swimming unit that we would have taught in previous years.</i></p>		<p>We are covering all the PE objectives detailed on our progression map through the two weekly slots.</p> <p>We have encouraging swimming data that is above national expectations.</p> <p>Inactivity is still a national issue. The recovery unit helps our children focus on personal best and being active. We monitor the success of our PE provision and keep records of children that need more support as well as those that excel. The priority we place on PE at MCS is continued in our extra-curricular offer. This term we are offering football, netball, girls’ football, dance and multiskills.</p>	<p>Val Sabin units are being taught alongside our new PE topic PowerPoints. The PowerPoints are used before the lesson to explain the learning objective for the lesson. Any ‘sticky knowledge’ from prior learning is discussed. Before leaving the class, instruction is given on how the skills and activities we will use practise today, will help us to achieve the learning objective.</p> <p>On returning to class, the PowerPoint is used to review the learning and children are asked to self-assess against Bronze, Silver and Gold success criteria.</p> <p>We will continue to embed this next year to build on our children’s understanding of what they are learning and how to achieve this.</p> <p>We have had to make changes to our curriculum this year in KS2, reducing our swimming to one (rather than two) intensive swimming weeks per class. Unfortunately, the costs have been prohibitive. Also, in the current economic climate we are looking at ways of reducing costs for our parents as we rely on a voluntary contribution for swimming. 				<p>have cut our costs this year by operating a 'walking bus' to and from the pool. This was trialled by our Year 3 classes successfully and we will continue this next year.</p> <p>Figures are encouraging this year for those reaching 25m. However, this will be more challenging going forward and we will look at allocating some of the fund in future for those that might need extra sessions. PSSP are also looking at funding for those year 6 that have not reached 25m and how they can be supported as part of transition into year 7.</p>
