



MOUNT CHARLES SCHOOL

BOOK DAY 7 MARCH 2024

On Thursday we celebrated World Book Day 2024. The children were invited to attend school dressed as either, "What would you like to do when you're older?", "Where would you like to go?" or "Who would you like to meet?". Our theme

in school was "Someday" based on the book by Eileen Spinelli. As part of the celebrations, our Reading Ambassadors and Class Librarians visited KS1 to deliver and share











EYFS have been enjoying the story 'The Gingerbread Man' and have been investigating what would happen when the Gingerbread Man crossed the river. They began by thinking about the ingredients needed to make a gingerbread man. They all got to taste the biscuit which was sweet and crunchy. The children then tried dipping the biscuit into warm water. They found the sugar dissolves so the gingerbread man went soggy, fell apart and then disappeared.





Year One have been consolidating their understanding of odd and even numbers this week. The children are becoming experts at using their rekenrek to break numbers into parts. This year, the rekenreks have really helped the children with learning their number bonds to 10 and beyond quickly.







Year 2 had a great trip to Pendennis Castle. We began the day with a workshop learning about the history of the castle and how life has changed since Tudor times. The children were able to dress up as King Henry V111. We walked around the dry moat and discussed the different features of the castle and their purpose. We loved exploring the canon room and looking out from the windows and even spotted St. Mawes castle! The children were also very lucky to witness a 'gun salute' as the canons went off!

















In science Year 3 studied plant stems and how they transport water. They found that the carnations sucked up food through the stem. The seeds they planted are growing really well. The children have now started planning what fruit and vegetables they are going to put in their tart for DT.







Year 4 have been working incredibly hard this week on home learning, with pictures about mountains, mountainous activities and some delicious looking edible peaks! In science this week, the children have been looking at the viscosity of liquids, conducting experiments to see how much viscosity these liquids had based on how quickly they moved down a ramp! The children then drew their own tables to record their findings.
















In science, Year 5 have been continuing to learn about living things. They have been watering their plants each day and are really pleased with the results! The sunflowers and basil are now starting to grow.

The children have also created their own worm farms to investigate the conditions needed for them to grow and reproduce. They have been feeding the worms fruit and vegetable peelings, as well as old tea bags! Each week, the children have been counting the number of worms and their length; they have been surprised to see how much they have grown in such a short period of time!





Year 6 used some fantastic models to learn more about inheritance in science. The children observed the characteristics of the male and female and then invented their own off-spring. They were able to explain that some characteristics (such as dark hair) are more dominant and therefore more likely to be passed down. They have been working on writing explanations in science so that they can pass on their knowledge to others which is one of our scientific skills.







Last week, we took a group of Year 3 and 4 girls to Poltair to take part in the second round of this years Cornwall School Games Girls football.

The children played 3 matches, winning 1, losing 1 and had 1 draw. They did so well and have qualified for the spring school games finals in Bodmin next week. We are so proud of the children who are improving each time they play. Well done all.





The children had a wonderful morning listening to choirs from all over Cornwall- a brilliant musical morning was had!









How we celebrate good attendance: Each week, the class with the highest attendance is awarded the attendance trophy and an extra break time. Last week's winners were **2HM** with 100%. This week's winners are **6AW** with 97.9%. Well done to both classes! Our whole school attendance this week is 95%.

<u>Next week is our Lucky Draw week -</u> any pupil who has achieved 100% for the week will receive a treat and be put into a prize draw! There will be a KS1 and a KS2 prize.

Big end of term reward: Every term we will have an attendance reward for all pupils who have achieved 96.8% or higher during that term. At the start of each term **(for the purpose of the reward only)** we start every child's attendance at 100%. This means that every child has a chance to achieve 96.8% each term and enjoy the celebration.

Please give **full details** of the reason for absence so that our admin team can code the absence appropriately . Please avoid using phrases such as "poorly" or "sick" and instead give details of symptoms.

Repeat this for **every day** of absence. If you know you may need to request leave from school for **exceptional circumstances**, such as national sports competitions or visa appointments, please complete a leave request form from the office.
