The children have been developing their sculpting skills and manipulating paper mache through squeezing, pinching, pulling, pressing, rolling, squashing and flattening. 
Year 2 have been putting their designing skills into action to create some fantastic moving minibeasts. They have been learning all about toys and their moving parts. They then applied their learning to

This week Year 4 have begun designing their Viking houses, in preparation for building them next week. They have continued their learning on circuits and the children have learnt the difference between an open switch and a closed switch. They built both circuits and compared them.









Year 5 gave a performance to their adults this week with their brass instruments. They have been learning to play all term with Anna from the Cornwall Music Service and gave an incredible performance of Smoke in the Water and the James Brown Classic - I Feel Good!





Year 6 loved presenting what they had learnt this term in their express assembly. The children performed the samba pieces with enthusiasm and enjoyed eating the Mexican food they had made during the week. It was a real celebration of their Hola Mexico topic and a wonderful opportunity to showcase their hard work.









Mount Charles ARB had a great time taking part in a sensory session held at Pencalenick. They ran, jumped, crawled and explored the sensory equipment with their peers. It was a great way to celebrate the end of the school year and acknowledge all the progress the children have made.





Last week our Year 6 team played their final school cricket match in the against Sandy Hill. Our cricket teams have had the opportunity to play weekly matches against other local schools. The children have played amazingly well and have all improved their game. Well done to our Year 6 team and we look forward to seeing our Year 5 children progress next year.

We will be having our attendance celebration reward for the summer term in the week beginning 17th July. This will be for all children achieving 96.3% and above, attendance for the term.


REMINDER: What to do if your child is absent:

Weather permitting, the PTA will be selling second hand uniform in the playground on Wednesday after school. Jumpers/cardigans £1.


School Lunches



Activities are taking place across Cornwall during the Summer holidays, from 24th July - 1st September




